If you want the academic best, then Allerton Grange is for you. We aim high and expect you to reach the very best standards. As a school, we are consistently in the top 25% of sixth forms nationally, with some subjects in the top 10% or higher.

Committed teachers work with you to achieve your best possible exam results; each subject's teaching time has been increased to 5 hours per week to support this. Your progress is tracked closely, with regular assessments, followed by attainment reports and predicted final grades.



## --- Allerton Grange --- has excellent facilities and equipment

Any visit to our school will show the wonderful facilities we have on site. These enhance your learning in lessons through access to the latest equipment and technology; laptops can also be borrowed and used in independent study.

From September 2021, our Sixth Form will be housed in a bespoke building containing brand new classrooms, a common room and study areas. This is completely separate from the lower school, giving a college feel whilst still enjoying small class sizes and individual support.

Sixth formers are part of the Allerton Grange community and experience greater independence through the Privilege Pass system which includes flexible study hours, early finish times, bespoke enrichment and wider opportunities outside of the Sixth Form.

Student attendance, conduct, attitude to learning and their contributions as active citizens within the school are taken into account and are reflected in the Gold, Silver and Bronze levels of the Privilege Pass, enabling students to earn more control over their Sixth Form experience.

# Your sixth form experience - more enrichment and personal development

As sixth formers, we encourage you to be independent and give you the tools you need to reach your full potential. Not only do we cover traditional pastoral topics and study skills, but we also include practical sessions on budgeting and cooking in preparation for life beyond Year 13.

We offer the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ); this is an opportunity to grow essential skills such as research and self-discipline which are essential for undergraduate study.

Work experience is an integral part of your sixth form experience. In combination with regular visits from local and national employers, your weeks on placement give you important knowledge and experience prior to your making major decisions about your higher education and future career.

We want you to achieve your dreams and will work alongside you to support your applications to university, apprenticeships and employment.

### University Partnerships

The vast majority of Allerton Grange students go on to university, and we have some exceptionally strong links with local and national universities.

The Progression Module is delivered in conjunction with Leeds Beckett University during tutorials, allowing you to research and plan your next steps after sixth form. Additional UCAS points are awarded for the successful completion of this course.

We regularly have university admissions tutors visiting school offering advice on UCAS applications. We also organise numerous visits to universities throughout the year. This includes lectures and taster events specifically for Allerton Grange students, giving an insight into university life before you start.

We have a specialist programme of support for students applying to Oxbridge and Russell Group universities. Our Aim High tutor helps students through the application process and to prepare for interviews and admissions tests.





Our experienced careers advisor will offer you independent advice through regular meetings and support you to make informed choices about your future, whether that is university, apprenticeships or employment.

Comprehensive careers advice includes:

- Individual guidance appointments
- Careers education programme looking at all options
- Workshops on university applications and mock-interviews
- Advice on how to write an effective personal statement
- Results day support to access courses
- Workshops on student finance
- Occupational talks by speakers from a range of companies locally and nationally.

We are committed to supporting our students to achieve their goals after they complete their studies at Allerton Grange.

With our Sixth Form being in the top 25% of sixth forms in the country, it means that our students are amongst the most likely to go to a university of their choice and take the course that best suits their career plans.

In 2019, 34% of students were offered places at Russell Group Universities, including the University of Leeds, the University of Liverpool, the University of Manchester, Newcastle University, the University of Sheffield and the University of York.

Allerton Grange students have gone on to study a range of subjects at university including Accountancy and Finance, Architecture, Biomedical Science, Chemistry, Computer Science, Criminology, English, Geography, History, Law, Pharmacy, Physics and Sociology.
