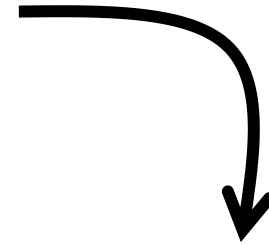




Step 1

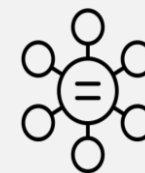
Use the topic checklists to decide which topic you are going to revise. Get your notes and revision guides ready.

Exam Questions

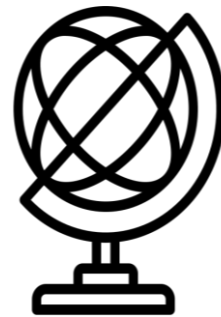
4 Marks – Point marked – Need to say at least 4 points or develop points. Easy to underestimate how much is needed.

6 mark (and your own knowledge) – Use the figure as a starting point and then use your own knowledge to develop. Don't rely on the figure. Lots of own knowledge needed.

6 mark (analyse) – No own knowledge needed. Use the OHLAD structure to use the data in the figure only.

9 mark (Section C only) - You should be looking to include a range of appropriate and detailed knowledge. This information should be used to make decisions related to the question. Use this knowledge to assess and evaluate within your responses and reach a conclusion.

20 mark Questions – Large synoptic question covering lots of information. 10 marks for Knowledge so demonstrate what you know about processes and content. 10 marks for analysis - Use this A01 knowledge to develop, apply and evaluate. Use the PEACE structure and finish with a strong SASY conclusion
