
The FACE it revision model in Religious Studies



Use the <u>revision guide</u> to create notes on specific topics. These can be in the form of:

- Flash cards (key words and topics)
- Bullet points to summarise
- Mind maps categorising ideas
- Verses for sources of wisdom and authority





Test yourself - do you actually know the topic from memory?

- 'Brain-dump' mind-map on a general topic. Write down as much as you can, then check your notes to identify what you didn't remember!
- Use Seneca/GCSE Bitesize/your revision sheets to see where your gaps are
