## **Academic Vocabulary**

'Words Matter' is a programme designed to improve literacy levels in KS3. Students need to learn these words to be able to fully access the curriculum, examinations, and a wide range of academic texts.

**1. illustrate** provide (a book, newspaper, etc.) with pictures.

Serve as an example of.

The phone company provided a manual to illustrate how to use the device.

Synonyms: show, demonstrate, represent, exemplify

**2. immigrate** come to live permanently in a foreign country.

There are many well-educated, skilled workers in other countries who would love to immigrate to the UK.

Synonyms: migrate, relocate, resettle

**3. imply** indicate the truth or existence of (something) by suggestion rather than direct reference.

Their failure to reply to our letter seems to imply a lack of interest.

Synonyms: suggest, insinuate, infer

**4. initial** existing or happening at the beginning.

Once the initial shock had worn off, I got to like my new hairstyle.

Synonyms: beginning, opening, first

**5. instance** an example or single occurrence of something.

Chewing gum is just one instance of rule-breaking. **Synonyms: infer, example, occasion, case** 

**6. interact** act in such a way as to have an effect on each other.

A change in temperature may cause certain chemicals to interact with each other.

Synonyms: interrelate, combine, interface

**7. justify** show or prove to be right or reasonable.

The oil companies were accused of planning a shortage of petrol to justify price increases.

Synonyms: explain, account for, rationalise

fund a sum of money to be used for a particular purpose.

The newspaper launched an appeal fund for victims of the disaster.

Pension funds allow people to secure their future when they retire from work.

Synonyms: collection, pool, finance
