The inspectors truly understood what we're all about. They picked up on the strong sense of community, the way we celebrate our diversity, and the warm, respectful relationships between staff and students. One student summed it up perfectly: "This is a really welcoming and diverse school." That kind of feedback means so much.

Other highlights from the OFSTED report include:

- Pupils' behaviour is excellent. They are attentive in lessons and move around the school site quietly and sensibly. Pupils are polite and well mannered. They are happy and have positive attitudes to learning. They enjoy explaining what they have learned to visitors.
- Pupils feel safe and have trusted adults. Sixth-form students act as strong role models to younger pupils.

We're especially proud of the praise our students received for their excellent behaviour. The inspectors noticed how focused and polite they were in lessons, and how keen they were to share their learning with visitors. Our Sixth Formers also stood out as fantastic role models – exactly the kind of young leaders we hope to nurture here at Allerton Grange.

The report also highlighted our high standards and ambitions for every student. Their success in exams reflects the hard work of our staff and students, and our ongoing efforts to keep improving and adapting our curriculum.

Meanwhile, some of our students are currently enjoying an amazing trip to Valencia! We've had great feedback on how engaged and enthusiastic they've been – a big thank you to the staff who've helped make this experience possible.

On 29 May, the Year 12 English Literature students had the exciting opportunity to visit Leeds Playhouse to watch a dramatised version of Tess of the D'Urbervilles - one of the novels that we study at A level. The play was performed by Ockham's Razor: a theatre group which combines storytelling with circus skills in order to produce a performance like no other.

Though Tess is a tragedy, the performers intertwined the sombre and subdued narrative with moments of laughter, joy and playfulness, truly reflecting the fluctuating emotions of the human experience.

Wowing the audience with incredible feats of acrobacy (including a three-person high tower and a spinning wheel), Ockham's Razor did an amazing job of guiding the spectators through the story through physical movement, relying only on a single narrator for speech.

School for Artforms. This is in recognition of the development of the Music Department over the years and the strong plans to improve it further. Music Champion status last for 3 years.














Arts Award Discover

We were absolutely blown away by his final presentation - it was thoughtful, engaging, and showcased just how much hard work and imagination he put into every step of the process.


His commitment and talent truly shone through, and we couldn't be prouder of everything he has accomplished.


