## Academic Vocabulary

'Words Matter' is a programme designed to improve literacy levels in KS3. Students need to learn these words to be able to fully access the curriculum, examinations, and a wide range of academic texts.

**1. layer** a sheet, quantity, or thickness of material, typically one of several, covering a surface or body.

The outer layer of human skin is called the epidermis. The ozone layer surrounding the earth protects our skin from being hurt by ultravio-let rays from the sun. Synonyms: coating, veneer, stratum, tier

2. link a relationship between two things or situations, especial-ly where one affects the other. Words matter because there is a proven link between good vocabulary and educational success.

#### Synonyms: connection, relationship

3. **locate** discover the exact place or position of; put into a par-ticular place or context. Allerton Grange School is located in North Leeds. The steward was easy to locate as she wore a bright yellow jacket.

#### Synonyms: find, pinpoint, track down, situate

**4. maximise** make as large or great as possible; make the best use of The shopkeeper tried to keep prices high and costs

low, in order to maximise profits.

#### Synonyms: make the most of, optimise

5. **minor** Lesser (or low) in importance, seriousness, or significance.

His injuries were only minor and didn't require hospital treatment.

Synonyms: small, unimportant, junior, lesser, subordinate Antonym: major

**6. negate** make ineffective or cancel; deny the existence of

Photos of Earth, taken from outer space, clearly negate the idea that the Earth is flat.

#### Synonyms: nullify, reverse, undo, invalidate

7. outcome the way a thing turns out; a consequence

Huge improvements at our school led to a really good outcome at our last inspection.

## Synonyms: (end) result, consequence, conclusion

**8. partnership** a cooperative relationship between people or groups

Many schools, including ours, enter into partnerships with other schools to share ideas or resources, and to improve teaching and learning.

Synonyms: association, cooperation, collaboration
