4. series a number of events, objects, or people of a similar or related kind coming one after another.

The explosion was the latest in a serious of bad accidents.

5. shift change place or direction
She shifted her position slightly so she could see the stage better:

Public opinion has shifted dramatically in recent months.

Synonyms: move, budge, change

6. specified clearly and explicitly stated Students were only allowed to wear clothes that are specified in the uniform lists;

All the ingredients were clearly specified in the recipe.

Synonyms: required, stated, called for

7. sufficient Enough to satisfy a need or requirement

He didn't have sufficient money to buy the best clothes.

Supplies were late because there wasn't a sufficient supply of delivery drivers.

Synonyms: enough, adequate, satisfactory

8. task a piece of work often to be finished within a certain time

Classes started with a simple task to allow students to settle into their learnina:

In Greek mythology, the '12 labours of Hercules' were almost impossible tasks.

Synonyms: job, chore, duty, endeavour
