Little Shop of Horrors Audition Packs

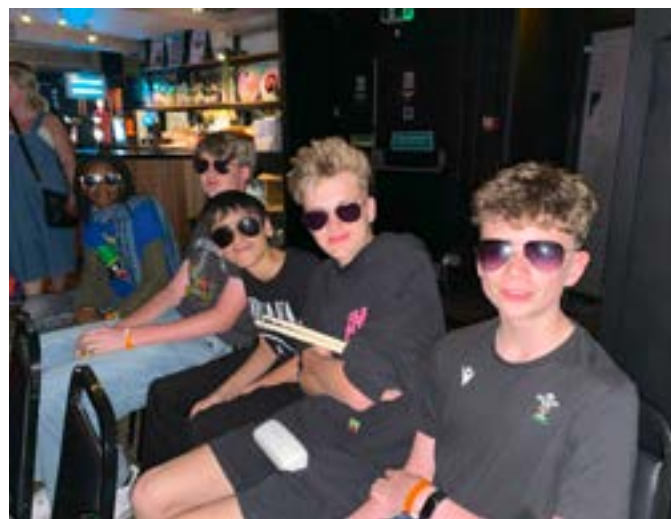
The hotly anticipated audition packs are ready for next year's production of Little Shop of Horrors.
