

Drop your child off further away from school to reduce congestion and improve safety





Detention times:

Stage 2 Detention - Mondays 3.00 - 4.00 pm (60 minutes)

SLT Detention - Wednesdays 3.00 - 4.30 pm (90 minutes)

Isolation/Reflection takes place between 9.00 am - 3.00 pm/3.30 pm/4.00 pm depening on behaviour.
