#### **Swimming**

Last Saturday, we took the first ever Allerton Grange Swim team down to Sandwell Aquatic Centre in Birmingham to compete in the national teams finals. Both the Year 7/8 team and the Year 9/10 team took part in two finals (the team freestyle and team medley races). The Year 7/8 team consisted of Millie, Betsey, Barney and Danny. The Year 9/10 team was Sophia, Evie, Harrison and Will.

After a very early start and warm up, two of our students (Millie and Harrison) were chosen to hold the north east placard during the opening ceremony.



In our first race of the day the Year 7/8 team competed in the freestyle event and finished in 8th place. The Year 9/10 team then competed in the same event, having the 7th fastest qualifying time. The students put in an absolutely fantastic effort in this and finished in 4th place after swimming over a second faster than their qualifying time, and finishing 0.4 seconds off 3rd place.

This resulted in the team winning the President's award for the best performing state school in this event.

The Year 9/10 team then finished the final race of the day with the medley event and swam over 3 seconds faster than their qualifying time but unfortunately this was only enough to finish 5th.



The students did amazingly well and were competing against some very established swimming schools and should be very proud of their efforts.

### The ESU Debate Competition – recognition and results.

On Monday 10 November, students from AGS took part in the first round of the ESU Schools' Mace debating competition at Cardinal Heenan in Leeds, arguing in favour of banning short-haul flights.

Before revealing the results, we must recognise our three incredible speakers – Henry (Year 11), Sasha (Year 11) and Izzy (Year 12), who worked incredibly hard researching, writing, and performing their speeches brilliantly in front of a live audience. They worked together as a great team: asking and answering POIs (points of interest) as well as thinking quickly and consistently throughout the debate.

But they didn't do it alone, Molly and Jasmine (both Year 13) provided wonderful support in the research and development of ideas and even creating counter-arguments for the team.

Additionally, on the night of the debate, Felix (Year 11) volunteered to be in charge of the timer for each and every speaker, and Lila (Year 11) took notes and provided feedback on the speeches. And of course, Ms. Zoughi and Ms. Westwell were the teachers who helped organise and oversee not only the debate, but also the preparation, mock debates and redrafting processes.

Finally, the results – thanks to the hard work done by everyone on the team, our school has proudly made it through to the next round and will be diligently continuing the competition, hopefully until the very end!

#### A level Physics University Trip

On Tuesday, AGS A level Physicists went to the A-level Physics Science Live event, hosted at the University of Birmingham. Here our students got to see talks from eminent Physicists including Professor Jim Al-Khalili (from BBC4's The Life Scientific), Professor Frank Close (Professor Emeritus of Oxford University, and Head of Communications at CERN) as well as talks from Dr Hannah Sargeant, Dr Emma Chapman and Prof Trevor Cox.

Pupils' favourite topics were a fascinating discussion of the first billion years of the universe, a talk on quantum mechanics (and the "real" history of the Physics behind the Oppenheimer film), and exciting new research on acoustic engineering. There was also a study tips session from an A level Physics examiner.



Student behaviour was exemplary throughout the day, a credit to the school, especially arriving back at school quite late in the evening.





#### SEND Bowling Trip

This week was our much anticipated annual Bowling Trip for a group of SEND students. They had a fantastic time and entered into the spirit of the competition with lots of enthusiasm. Two members of the team scored over 100 points - 121 and 122 respectively! The team came second overall and brought a trophy back to school which is very proudly displayed at reception.

#### **Road Safety Week**

Everyone has a responsibility to use roads safely, whether you are walking, cycling or driving.



Tips to be safer out and about on or near roads:

- Role model safe and healthy travel behaviours eg always wear your seatbelt and walk everyday journeys where you can.
- Avoid unnecessary car journeys to redue congestion and road safety concerns. Can your child get to school by walking, cycling or car sharing?
- Ensure your child has appropriate clothing and equipment for walking and cycling. Cyclists must wear a helmet and your child should always have bright, visible clothing.
- Never break the law while driving. This includes obeying speed limits and parking legally so that pavements are safe for pedestrians.
- Stay alert if you are driving near any schools during the morning or after school run. We remind pupils of their responsibilities to be safe road users, but they can sometimes forget, get distracted and step into the road.

What can I do to make safer journeys?

We all have a responsibility to use roads safely to protect ourselves and others. We can choose safe ways to travel using safe vehicles at safe speeds.






#### **Cycling Safely**


