Eleven students re-sat their GCSE English exam in November. Each one has now achieved a grade 4 or above, with some students improving by 3 grades from the summer. Well done to you all!

• Extended Project Qualification (A level programme supplement):

The EPQ is additional qualification where students have to submit and present a detailed research project on a topic of their choice. The results are in for our current Y13s and 84% achieved a grade A*-C, with 23% securing a grade A or A*. Many congratulations to you all!

The project has been extended by Leeds City Council until March 2023.




Shakespeare Workshop
