They listed the hardest secondary schools across Leeds to get a place for your Year 6 child – the data was based on applications and the number of rejections of first and second preferences. Allerton Grange was the 4th hardest to admit your child. This is a credit to everyone who has worked so hard to make Allerton Grange the school of first choice in our local community and what a transformation, considering back in 2015 we couldn't even fill Year 7 with 240 students.

**Lisa in Year 12** was nominated for being a finalist in the Northeast London Essay Competition, with her essay about Ethical Artificial Intelligence.


**Akar in Year 13** was nominated for his focused and positive attitude to his studies, as well as for some very good work produced in Health and Social Care.
