Curriculum Developments for September 2023:

As you already know we are extending the school day next year (staring school at 8:30am and finishing at 3:00pm). This will provide each and every student with an additional 83 hours of learning across the academic year.

This additional time has helped us secure the following curriculum developments:

- All subjects across Key Stage 3 and 4 will gain increased curriculum time.
- All students across Key Stage 3 will receive curriculum time in Classics and Computing.
- All students (Year 7 Year 13) will have enrichment opportunities built into their weekly timetable. Students will have a choice from a wide range of enrichment sessions. This develops the Aspirational Enrichment cornerstone of the KLAS curriculum model.
- We have significantly increased the amount of Science curriculum time, bringing them in line with Maths and English. As such, every student in KS3 and KS4 will receive an additional 23 hours of Science teaching across a full academic year.

These are exciting developments to the Allerton Grange curriculum offer and makes our already aspirational curriculum even stronger.

Local Authority Behaviour and Attitudes Review (26 April 2023):

We commissioned the Local Authority to conduct a full review into student behaviour and attitudes at Allerton Grange. This review was completed on Wednesday this week (26 April) by an Ofsted inspector and the following feedback was given:

- "Student behaviour is undoubtedly strong at Allerton Grange."
- "Leaders have created a calm and orderly school environment where pupils feel safe and can learn."
- "The school has a very clear and simple behaviour policy which is understood by all students and staff."
- "The behaviour policy is applied consistently by all staff."
- "Behaviour in lessons is of an extremely high standard no low level disruption was observed."
- "Student behaviour at lesson changeover is impeccable."
- "At social times students conduct themselves in an orderly and calm manner. Students are very well supervised and there is no litter."

We are obviously very pleased with the outcome of this review which we believe truly reflects the standards in behaviour at Allerton Grange.

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Reminder: From September 2023, there will be changes to the timings of the School Day.

Students will need to arrive by 8.25 am for Registration at 8.30 am.

The School Day will be amended, with the first lesson starting at 9.15 am.

School will still finish at 3.00 pm, unless students are staying for extra-curricular clubs, revision sessions or detentions.



All students should leave the school site by 3.10pm unless attending a session 7 or working with a member of staff. There is to be no waiting in the cafe after school. The only students in the building must be involved in Enrichment sessions, a session 7, or isolation/detention.

(Monday) Stage 3 - SLT Detentions = 3:05pm = 4:30pm (85 minutes) (Tuesday - Friday) Stage 1 Detentions = 3:05pm - 3:35pm (30 minutes) Stage 2 Detentions - 3:05pm = 4:00pm (55 minutes) Isolation takes place between 9:00am-3pm/3.30pm/4.00pm (Depending on Behaviour)

There is no immediate change as the current School Day timings remain for the Summer Term (April to July 2023).

The new times will start after the summer holidays, in September 2023.
