### RED Award update and launch of "Free To Be Me" news:

Three years ago, when Ofsted visited Allerton Grange, they celebrated our diversity: "This is a multicultural school and pupils enjoy the diversity."

Over the past 12 months, led by Ms Turner-Lindley, we have audited our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion provision against a regional wide set of criteria called the **RED (Respect/Equality/Diversity) Award.** 

In December 2022, Allerton Grange secured the "Certificate of Commitment to Equality & Diversity". Since then, we have been working on an action plan to ensure that EDI is embedded into every aspect of our school life and the daily experiences of our students and staff.

Today, we launch a regular section of our Newsletter – Free To Be Me. This section will celebrate and share with our community the differences that exist within the Allerton Grange School community. Today, I want to share with you just how diverse the AGS community is.

Our AGS school community includes 1700 students and 250 staff from 52 different ethnic groups and 7+ faith groups.

Within the school community we have:

- Students and staff who are LGBTQ+
- Students and staff with a range of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities
- A cohort of visually impaired students supported by specialist staff in our SEND Team
- A cohort of hearing impaired students supported by our in-school DAHIT unit, including staff who are Deaf

Everyone at Allerton Grange can celebrate these differences whilst recognising the strength of our community.




### Reminder: From September 2023, there will be changes to the timings of the School Day.

Students will need to arrive by 8.25 am for Registration at 8.30 am.

The School Day will be amended, with the first lesson starting at 9.15 am.

School will still finish at 3.00 pm, unless students are staying for extra-curricular clubs, revision sessions or detentions.



All students should leave the school site by 3.10pm unless attending a session 7 or working with a member of staff. There is to be no waiting in the cafe after school. The only students in the building must be involved in Enrichment sessions, a session 7, or isolation/detention.

(Monday) Stage 3 - SLT Detentions = 3:05pm = 4:30pm (85 minutes) (Tuesday - Friday)

Stage 1 Detentions = 3:05pm - 3:35pm (30 minutes)

Stage 2 Detentions - 3:05pm - 4:00pm (55 minutes)

Isolation takes place between 9:00am-3pm/3.30pm/4.00pm (Depending on Behaviour)

There is no immediate change as the current School Day timings remain for the Summer Term (April to July 2023).

The new times will start after the summer holidays, in September 2023.
