

On Wednesday and Thursday evenings this week, the Chair of Governors (Barbara Trayer) and I presented to parents about plans to secure the long term success of Allerton Grange.

We informed parents that due to a number of factors, namely national government education policy and the shrinking of capacity within the Local Authority, the leadership at Allerton Grange were looking at long term partnerships moving forward.

One option that we are investigating is the possible conversion to academy status and joining a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT).

The governing body have been proactive, they have already conducted some initial investigations and identified 3 possible MATs that might meet the long term needs of Allerton Grange (see the slides). This is far from a done deal and governors have given a commitment that no conversion would take place until September 2025.

Further investigative work will be carried out by the school leadership over the coming months and we will keep parents informed via updates on the weekly newsletter.

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
Careers Fair for students in KS4 & 5
