AGS students ASPIRE-GROW-SUCCEED

"Allerton Grange is committed to ensuring that all students have the subject knowledge, the vocabulary, the experiences and the character to secure places at world-renowned universities and on elite training programmes, which will enable them to make aspirational career choices." This quote is from our 2025 vision statement and as you can see, destinations (where students move to on their education/training/ employment journey) are very important to us. Since September, we have received a variety of data and information about where Allerton Grange Students progress post-16 and post-18. Here are some of the headlines:

Year 11 students (2023):

- 40% accepted into AGS Sixth Form.
- 40% secured places at Leeds City College.
- 6% are attending Notre Dame Sixth Form College.
- 3% are attending Leeds College of Building.
- 2% have secured apprenticeships.
- 8% are attending other educational providers.
- 3% are NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training). This figure compares to 5.2% nationally and 9.2% across Leeds.

Year 12 students (2023):

- 95% retention rate of students moving into their final year of A level programme. (This is significantly better than the 91% nationally and 89% for Leeds)
- 20 students are required to take early entry assessments to secure their post-18 placement:
- 5 students applying to Cambridge University.
- 1 student applying to Oxford University.
- 10 students applying to study medicine.
- 4 students applying to study dentistry.

Year 13 students (2023):

- 70% of students secured places at university.
- 25% secured places at Russell Group universities. (This compares to 15% nationally and 14% across Leeds).
- 20% have moved straight into employment.
- 1 student secured a degree apprenticeship.

We are so proud of every students who has completed their full 5 or 7 years of education at Allerton Grange – the vast majority move onto suitably aspirational education programmes or training.

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
Careers Fair for students in KS4 & 5
