



Welcome Back!

It was lovely to see everyone back in school this week after the half term break.

Here is a reminder about the start of the school day and the importance of being on time.

- The school site opens at 8.15 am and students are expected to be in school by 8.25 am.
- Registration starts at 8.30 am. Students need to be in their form room, at their desk, ready to learn BEFORE 8.30 am.
- If students are arriving to school at 8.30 am, they are already late.

• In line with the PPD, students arriving late to school will receive a behaviour point. Three behaviour points within a seven-day period results in a Stage 1, 30 minute after-school detention.

Being on time helps children and young people start the day settled, relaxed and ready to learn. Help your child have a good start to the day by leaving more time for the journey to school. If you drive your child to school, keep in mind that traffic is often busier during the winter months and darker mornings, so please plan ahead and drive carefully, especially near the school site.

Studies have shown that being late to school can negatively impact children and young people. Arriving late means a student is missing out on time in school and disrupting their learning, as well as impacting on opportunities to connect with their peers. Students may feel stressed and embarrassed, and this can have a negative effect on their mental health and sense of wellbeing.

Academisation Update from the Board of Governors:

Further to the information provided before half-term, as promised, the following is a brief summary of what the governors agreed as to the next steps at the EGM held on 25 October 2023:

• To produce a comparison of the services/costs currently provided by the LEA (Local Education Authority) and the MAT (Multi Academy Trusts)

• To invite the ASCL (Association of Schools and College Leaders) consultant, who specialises in providing schools with independent and impartial advice/guidance regarding academisation, to spend 2 further days with us to:

(a) Meet with each of the shortlisted MAT's CEO's (3-hour sessions) on 1st and 2nd February 2024, where they will each be asked the same questions

(b) The Governors will be producing the questions including those raised at our parent/ carer information evenings

(c) To receive verbal feedback followed by a written report

(d) FGB (Full Governing Body) meeting to formally to discuss the findings and decide the next steps.

As stated previously, we are not in any hurry to convert to become an academy and will only do so if it is in the best interests of the students, staff and wider community.

The next update will be after we have discussed the findings from the meetings in early February and hopefully will be around February half term.


