Computer coding whizzes recognised by Oxford University

Allerton Grange students have once again performed brilliantly in this year's Oxford University Bebras Challenge.

In KS3, Seb, Omar, Alfie, Joshua, Charlie, Imogen, Jasper, Ollie, Anaïs, Ming Yan (all Year 8) and Marley (Year 9) were in the top 10% of UK students (out of 209,000). In KS4, Matthew (Year 11) and Reuben (Year 10) were in the top 10% for their age range.

A special mention to Ming Yan and Matthew who were the highest scoring students in their category within the school.

The students who achieved in the top 10% are invited to the Oxford Computing Challenge which is just for UK students. This will take place in January, and again is an online competition.

Exciting plans for our Student Leadership Group (SLG)

This week members of our SLG presented their annual plans to Senior Leaders:

- 1. Student Peer mentoring programme** – Year 13 students will be identified and trained to provide subject specific mentoring for Year 12 students, and a similar programme will be put in place for Year 11 and Year 12 students.
- 2. Food Bank Collection** - We are excited to announce this year's winter food drive. We are asking for those families who are able, to bring in as many cans and packets of pasta and boxes of cereal as possible in order to help Leeds North and West Foodbank. There will be big boxes in Year pods for students to fill with contributions. Attendance Matters

At Allerton Grange, our target is for all students to achieve 100% attendance and punctuality. The minimum expectation is for all students to have 97% attendance over the academic year. We appreciate the efforts of parents, carers and families to ensure that students are attending school every day, and on time.

All parents and carers have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren receive a suitable education for their age and aptitude. Research has shown that excellent attendance is key for ensuring positive outcomes for children and young people, and is vital to students being able to learn effectively and take an active part in school life.

As we approach the end of term, please keep in mind that every day at school is important. All students are expected to be in school until their finish time on Friday 22 December 2023.

Below is a reminder of what to do if your child is ill, is going to be late or has an appointment during the school day:

Illness

If your child is ill, you can check the NHS website to help you decide if they are too ill to attend school: <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/>
If your child is absent, a parent/carer must contact school using ClassCharts before 8.30 am on each day of absence.

Lateness

If your child is going to be late to school, they need to have a note from their parent or carer explaining the reason why they are late. On arrival, the student must sign in at the Attendance Office and then go straight to their lesson. Persistent lateness will result in detention and/or isolation.

Appointments during the school day

Where possible, please make appointments for your child outside of school hours. If your child has an appointment during school time, this should be recorded on ClassCharts and they must take a note from their parent or carer to their Year Office to receive a green slip. At the time they need to leave school, the student must hand the slip into Main Reception, where they will receive a Police signing out slip. **Students should never leave school without permission.**

EPQ students visit University of Leeds

On Tuesday, Ms Ryding, Ms Fryer and Ms Gillibrand took 38 of our current EPQ cohort to the University of Leeds for an academic skills day.

The students participated in two workshops: Critical Thinking and Using Resources to develop their skills for both the EPQ and their core A-Levels. They were also given a tour of the campus where they had the opportunity to see two of the university libraries, go into the on-campus art gallery and get a taste of university life with Student Education Engagement Ambassadors working with us and answering questions all day.

Our students were able to demonstrate the skills they've been learning with Ms Ryding in the 'taught skills' sessions each week in school. The University of Leeds staff were very complimentary about this, feeding back that they were one of the best behaved and most engaged groups they've had.

Our students will do more work with the wonderful people at the University of Leeds later this year when they come into school to conduct an Academic Writing and Referencing workshop with the same students.

Some of the topics our students are exploring this year include: a history of dentistry; the role of the law in protecting peoples' mental health; the stigma associated with people suffering from addiction; an exploration of women in STEM and the impact being a child elite athlete has on the individual.



Medical Conference in Harrogate

On Wednesday this week, nine students who have applied to dentistry and medicine courses, were at a medical conference at Harrogate Grammar School.

The students worked solidly for 3 hours, honing their interview technique, carrying out patient role plays, testing their manual dexterity and debating ethical issues within the NHS.
