

#### Head students recruitment process:

Our Student Leadership Group (SLG) is the committee which oversees the workings of our student council lower down the school. The SLG is run by our sixth formers and is elected every year. There are two chairs of the SLG, namely our Head Students. Year 12 students apply for these prestigious posts and are interviewed by myself and Mr Macrow (KS5 Director). It is one of my favourite parts of the year, reading applications from students and then interviewing prospective Head Students. This year, we have had 11 applications and the quality of the supporting applications is so strong I want to share some of the statements with you:

One student writes – "Allerton Grange School simply does not allow its students to feel held back by any perceived disadvantages of attending a state school."

Another writes - "Having been at Allerton Grange for 6 years, I can clearly see that this school has shaped me into a person I feel confident being. I have learned many positive aspects of studying within a diverse community."

Another student comments - "... I have grown up with the Allerton Grange school values - not just ASPIRE, GROW, SUCCEED, but also to celebrate my school community's diverse cultural heritage, unlock the power of reading, and above all to feel empowered to pursue high aspirations."

One student also comments - "Over the last 6 years at Allerton Grange I have grown into a highly motivated and determined young woman with clear aspirations and a keen sense of self-worth. Our school has been at the heart of my transformation."

Finally, another application states - "Whilst at Allerton Grange, I have grown as a person with the help of the school's main values: Integrity, Compassion, Community and Humility. I feel the school has a very close community which has helped me establish lifelong friendships."

I have been blown away this week by the quality of the applications we received. I cannot wait to interview the students and then share with you in the coming weeks our new Head Students for 2024/25.

# School Uniform Exchange


As we approach the end of the school year, please consider donating outgrown unifrom to the Allerton Grange School Uniform Exchange.
