Reporting Student Absence

Parents and carers can use ClassCharts to report student absence to school. You can also upload any supporting evidence.

It is now 12 months since Allerton Grange School took a decision to become part of The Red Kite Alliance. This is partnership made up of 47 schools (primary and secondary) from across Yorkshire. The core purpose of the Alliance is to share skills, experience, talent and capacity to help improve the learning and achievement of the young people in our communities. We have found the Alliance incredibly beneficial in supporting the drive towards achieving our vision and I want to share with you some of the key achievements:

- 1. Strategic leadership being part of the Red Kite Alliance has supported this function in the following ways:
- a) I am a member of the **Steering Committee for the Red Kite Alliance**. This group helps format the direction of the Alliance in meeting its core functions.
- b) Peer Reviews School leaders and Ofsted inspectors from the Alliance give their time generously in reviewing aspects of each other's schools and making recommendations for improvements. Allerton Grange has experienced a Peer Review from the Headteacher of Benton Park (Leeds) and Kettlethorpe High School (Wakefield). I have conducted two Peer Reviews of schools in Leeds.
- c) School Improvement support we get access to some of the most experienced and successful school leaders from across the North of England. We are currently working with one such leader on developing our Key Stage Review programme.
- 2. Staff professional development there have been many opportunities for our staff to develop their knowledge and skills:
- **a) National Professional Qualifications –** these are educational leadership qualifications devised by central government. We have 10 colleagues taking these qualifications this year. Mrs Saunders (Deputy Head) and I have been delivering them to prospective leaders across the Alliance.
- **b) Curriculum networking –** all of our curriculum leaders are part of curriculum networking groups who meet with similarly passionate subject leaders from across the alliance every month to discuss the latest curriculum development.
- c) On 1 July this year all our staff will be attending a Red Kite Day. This is an opportunity for all the secondary schools in the partnerships to share professional development at the Harrogate Conference Centre.

3. RED Award:

This award that celebrates the inclusion and diversity work going on in schools is only available to Allerton Grange as a result of our involvement with Red Kite. Miss Turner-Lindley is leading on this and following her auditing work, she is very close to publishing our key priorities to further enhance inclusion and diversity across the school.

We are so pleased with the impact this partnership has had on improving the quality of provision our young people experience and so we are looking forward to working with the Alliance in the future.


Sport Experience Day

Synonyms: main, controlling, commanding

4. emphasis special importance, value, or prominence given to something. Some schools place great emphasis on language study.

Synonyms: importance, stress, priority, significance

5. ensure make certain that (something) will occur or be the case.

It is important to ensure that all the waste is properly and safely disposed of.

Synonyms: make certain, guarantee, secure

6. exclude deny (someone) access to a place, group, or privilege.

remove from consideration

In a Court of Law, judges can decide whether to admit or exclude evidence.

Synonyms: infer, shut out, prohibit, eliminate

7. framework an essential supporting structure of a building, vehicle, or object. We need to establish a legal framework for the protection of the environment.

The bridge over the river has a strong steel framework.

Synonyms: structure, skeleton, foundation, support

fund a sum of money to be used for a particular purpose.

The newspaper launched an appeal fund for victims of the disaster.

Pension funds allow people to secure their future when they retire from work.

Synonyms: collection, pool, finance

These students are part of the Brilliant Club who graduated at Newcastle University last week. Each student passed an assignment that they worked on, independently (see below).

- Independent research about a given subject (AGS had the following topic "To what extent does the differential distribution of power in society affect how an individual is perceived and how they experience life".
- working collaboratively with a tutor to critique their own work and respond to feedback.
- complete a 2000-word final assignment to university standard.

Some achieved a 2:1 at university level. This is amazing for Year 9 students to achieve something that is generally only achieved in the first year of university!


