The code for Allerton Grange School is **EE108058**.

Important: If you do not wish your child to receive the vaccination, you are still required to complete the "refusal section" on the form so that we understand your wishes. If we do not receive a consent or refusal form, your child will be given an opportunity to consent for themselves on the day, after being assessed by a nurse as competent to do so.


