I hope this message finds you well. I want to highlight a matter of great importance for your child's education and overall success - **School Attendance**.

At Allerton Grange, we are committed to providing every student with the best possible education, and regular attendance is fundamental to achieving this goal.

Missing school not only affects academic progress but can also impact a child's social development and emotional wellbeing.

Why Attendance Matters

Research consistently shows a strong link between attendance and achievement. Put simply, children who attend school regularly are more likely to succeed.

In England:

• In the 2022/23 academic year, pupils with attendance below 90% (classified as persistently absent) achieved significantly lower GCSE results than their peers, with just 36.2% achieving a grade 4 or above in English and Maths.

• Nationally, over 1 in 5 pupils (22.3%) were persistently absent in 2022/23, compared to 10.9% prepandemic in 2018/19.

• Every day of absence reduces learning opportunities. Just 90% attendance means your child is missing the equivalent of one day every two weeks - nearly a full month of learning over the year.

Our Commitment

We understand that children may occasionally need time off due to illness or exceptional circumstances. However, we ask for your full support in ensuring your child attends school every day, arrives on time, and is ready to access our fantastic KLAS curriculum.

If you are experiencing any difficulties that may be affecting your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to get in touch. Our Pastoral Team is here to help, and can offer support and guidance.

Let's work together to make sure your child gets the most out of their time at school - because every day really does count. Thank you for your continued support.

Visits to School

We deeply value our partnership with you in supporting your child's learning and wellbeing. In order to ensure that our staff can remain fully focused on teaching and supporting students throughout the day, we kindly remind all families that visits to the school must be made by appointment only.

Recently, we have seen an increase in parents/carers arriving without prior arrangements, which significantly disrupts our ability to maintain a safe and productive environment for all students. Please understand that, going forward, any parent/carer or visitor who arrives on site without an appointment will be asked to leave and contact the school to schedule a suitable meeting time.

Chemistry Olympiad by Ms Staley, Teacher of Chemistry/Physics

In January, fifteen of our Year 12 and Year 13 students entered the Chemistry Olympiad 2025.

This is a prestigious national competition, run by the Royal Society of Chemistry, which encourages students to develop their problem solving skills in this field. They attended weekly sessions in their own time to prepare for a two hour test, which is renowned for being particularly challenging. Participants demonstrated the AGS values of curiosity and courage, showing how resilient they are as they prepared and rose to the challenge.


