Safeguarding is strong at Allerton Grange

At Allerton Grange safeguarding our students is a top priority and as such we commission the Local Authority to conduct a full review every 2 years. On Monday, this week, we invited the Local Authority into school to complete a review of safeguarding procedures and practice.

They interviewed staff and students, scrutinised documentation and audited our safeguarding practice against 80 criteria. Against 99% of the criteria, the practice at Allerton Grange met the required standard – even better against 10% of the criteria our practice was judged to be exemplary.

The Auditor commented in the report:

"When speaking to the pupils, they were asked if they feel safe in school and what makes them feel safe. They said that they felt safe because of staff who are visible throughout the day, the fences around the school site and their friends. They went on to say that if they were scared or worried they would speak to their year manager but specifically mentioned Ms Whittingham and Ms Rowbotham as members of staff with responsibility for safeguarding. The pupils stated that when they had witnessed any bullying in school, it was dealt with promptly by members of staff. They stated that behaviour in school had improved, and when there was any inappropriate behaviour or fights, staff are very quick to act to diffuse the situation. I asked the pupils what they would do if they saw any pupils behaving in a sexually inappropriate way to another pupil and they all stated clearly that they would inform a member of staff immediately. They told me that they learn about keeping themselves safe through their PSHE lessons and tutor periods.

The members of staff spoken to were asked about safeguarding training and the contents of KCSiE 2022, Annex B. They said that they receive regular safeguarding training and updates from the safeguarding team and could tell me some of the contents of Annex B. When asked how they would raise a concern about a child, an adult and the headteacher they were correct in their answers.

There is evidence of exemplary work being undertaken at Allerton Grange particularly in how school supports pupils and how pupils are taught to safeguard themselves through the preventative curriculum."


