#### Student ambassadors:

It is always a delight to hear from visitors or members of the community praising our students. Last week I experienced two examples of this. Firstly, during our careers fair, (see details below) which was a wonderful event attended by over 50 higher education providers and employers; a visitor from Sheffield University approached me to comment on how aspirational our students were. She said they clearly have ambition and confidence in wanting to apply to some of the top universities in the country. This was great to hear. This was followed on Friday afternoon, when the last of our 110 Year 10 GCSE Geography students returned from their field work expedition on the Holderness coast, and a member of staff informed me she had been approached by a member of the public praising the conduct and maturity of our students during the field work surveys. We are so proud of all our students but messages like these are icing on the cake!

#### More external reviews:

Last month we experienced another review – this time from the local authority focusing on PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education). They were checking to see if Allerton Grange met the criteria to be awarded the new PSHE Friendly status by Leeds City Council. WE DID! – the report about the quality of PSHE was glowing. It stated:

"Great care and consideration have gone into implementing a curriculum that, not only meets the DfE statutory guidance, but also the needs of the students and the local community. It is regularly evaluated and adapted where necessary."

"The PSHE leader (Miss Beenan) is very responsive to current issues and, in response to Ofsted's review, swiftly implemented a sexual harassment policy and lessons across the school. Students spoke about the messages they receive and feel that this has made a big impact. They said that if issues were to arise now, they feel empowered to deal with them and feel a strong sense of community and support."

# Spotlight on the Curriculum

In this section we will provide updates on the curriculum and some of the topics year groups are studying during this half term.

#### In this issue we focus on Year 8:

#### Biology

This half term students are learning about how the structure of a leaf is related to function; sketching a line graph to show how the rate of photosynthesis is limited; describing the role of phloem in the leaf transport system, how root structure is adapted for function; and performing qualitative testing for starch in the leaf.

#### Computing

This half term students are working on 'Introduction to algorithms'.

#### Languages

**Spanish** - Past holiday descriptions, future holiday plans and dream holidays

French - Module 14 and 16 of Michel Thomas

German - Expressing opinions about food, eating out and shopping

#### Music

Currently students are participating in a '**Band Skills** unit or '**Creating Their Own Music**' on GarageBand. In the 'Band Skills' unit, students learn how to work independently and as an ensemble, developing all-round musicianship and performance skills on keyboards, ukulele, drums, guitar, and bass guitar. The song for this project is Seven Nation Army by The White Stripes. For 'Create Their Own Music', they are leaning how to put together chord progression in the key of C Major and develop the texture through adding loops and basslines, all the while learning how to use complex music software.
