Synonyms: the way things are; situation, state of affairs

3. comment a written or verbal opinion or answer to something

'Subscribe, hit like, and let us know what you think in the comments' is a common feature of social media posts.

Synonyms: response, remark, observation

4. compensate make up for something
If you have to wait too long for a takeaway delivery,
you may be given some free drinks as compensation.
The driver received a large amount of money as
compensation for her injuries.

Synonyms: recompense, redress

5. component a part or element of a larger object

Computers have many components.
Algebra and Trigonometry are two major components of maths.

Synonyms: part, element, constituent

6. consent permission for something to happen or agreement to do something. The school has records which show whether parents have given consent to take and publish photographs of students.

Synonyms: agreement, permission, authorisation, approval

During the Easter holidays, Charlie, Noah and Thomas from Year 10 were part of the Roundhegions team which won the under 15's Yorkshire Cup in Rugby Union. The 26-12 victory over a strong Hull Ionians RUFC side was the first ever for a Roundhegians age group team, and the first for any team at the club since the early 1980's, Thomas scored 16 of those 26 points, including two of the four tries.
