Reading is at the heart of our curriculum— both reading for pleasure and to ensure that students get the support they need.



# What makes our curriculum unique?

*The school prioritises reading. Pupils frequently read during 'Drop Everything And Read' sessions. Teachers read a range of novels to pupils during form time. As a result, pupils are developing a love of reading. Pupils who are weak readers receive an extensive range of support. They make rapid progress and swiftly improve their ability to read fluently.*



# How do we ensure high standards of teaching?

We are fully staffed with specialist teachers.

We employ excellent teachers and provide extensive professional development so we can all continue to grow and improve.

We invest in an extensive pastoral structure so that classrooms are calm, purposeful and disruption free.



# How do we ensure high standards of teaching?

*Teachers have excellent subject knowledge. They deliver the curriculum consistently and revisit key concepts regularly. This helps pupils to know and remember more.*



# What options are available to students?

We keep the curriculum as broad as possible for students in Key Stage Three (KS3).

When students reach KS4, they will take their core subjects, double or triple science, short course RS, history or geography and then have two further choices for their GCSEs.



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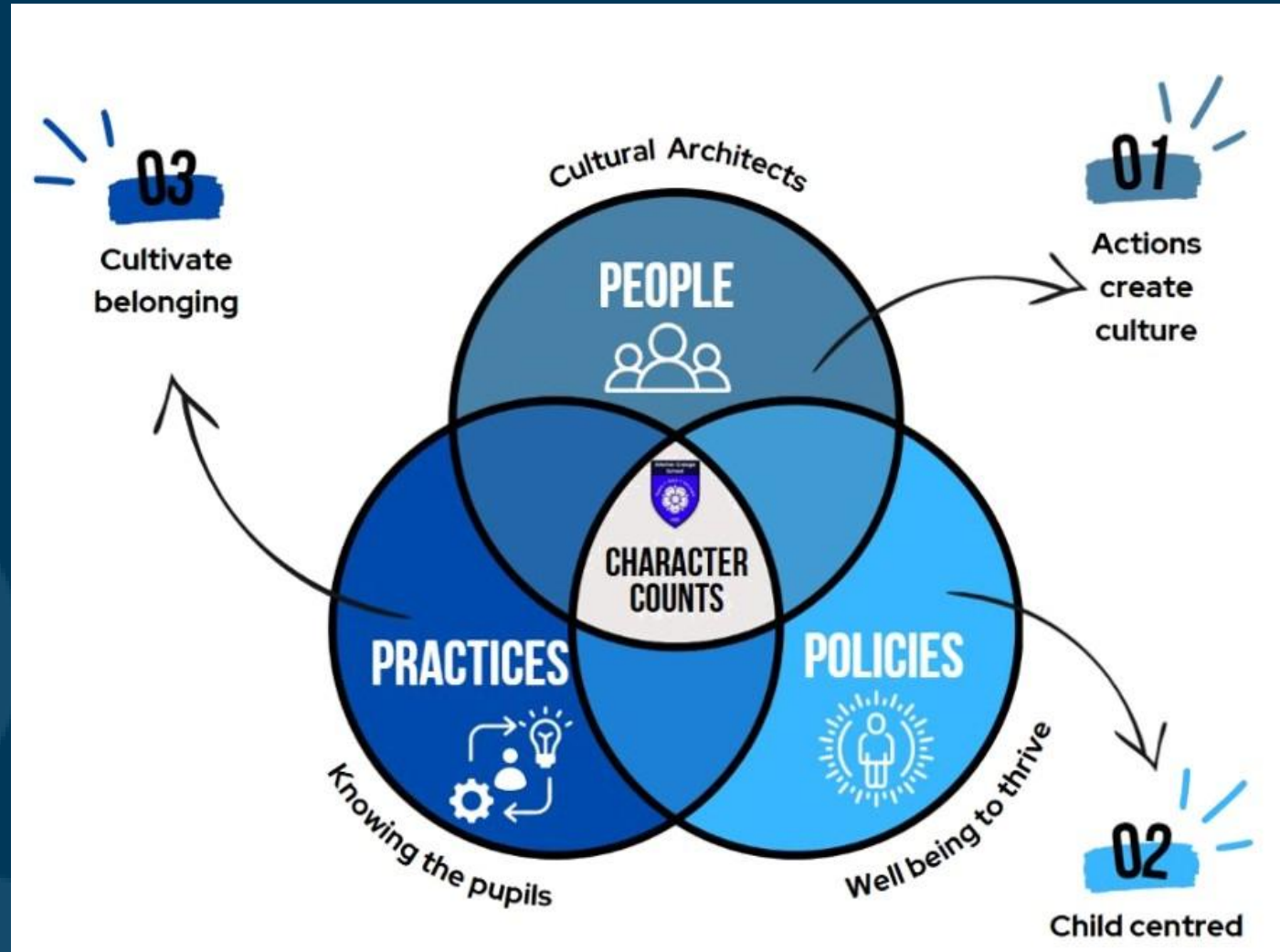
