16-19 School Bursary Fund

The 16-19 bursary fund is available to students with a household income of less than £25,000.00. Students who currently receive free school meals automatically qualify for bursary. The bursary is designed to help pay for items students need to stay on for further education. Examples of what this can be spent on include bus tickets, to and from school; equipment for courses (such as an appropriate school bag, folders, revision cards and pens); as well as activities and trips, which are part of the academic enrichment or wider enrichment programmes.
