Written responses may often be limited and students may tend to paraphrase from the text rather than infer. | | |
| Secure | Students have a good understanding of each literary period and they can recall relevant information about the writers they have studied. They will have a good understanding of the socio-historical context of each era. Students will begin to demonstrate some awareness of important issues explored within the literature they have analysed. Furthermore, students will be able to select some evidence from the text to justify their ideas and will begin to make relevant comments about how language is used to create meaning. Students will be able to make relevant inferences in their written responses to texts but this may not be consistently clear. | | |
| Complex | Students can recall a wide range of information about the writers of each literary period and they will have a detailed knowledge of the socio-historical context of each era. Students can confidently discuss how social factors influenced writers, taking into consideration important issues explored within literature at that time. Furthermore, students can confidently identify evidence from the texts they have encountered and will begin to discuss clearly how writers use language to create meaning. Students will begin to discuss their inferences with clarity in detailed written responses. | | |
