ELECTION OF PARENT GOVERNORS

I write further to my letter of 7 May inviting nominations for our parent governor vacancy.

Voting is on the basis of each parent and/or <u>legal</u> guardian being allowed to vote for <u>one</u> of the two candidates. If you have more than one child in school, it is possible you will receive more than one set of ballot papers, please throw away all but one.

The following should be written on the outer envelope: Name and form of your child; Name of Parent 1 along with signature; Name of Parent 2 along with signature (if applicable).

Please return the envelope which should contain one voting slip (per parent/carer) to me, either via your child's Form Tutor or main reception, at the school, by 3.00 pm, Monday 10 June 2024.

Counting of the votes will take place, in school, at 3.30 pm the same day. Once known, the results of the election will be communicated to the Governors' Unit at Leeds City Council, the parents of children at Allerton Grange and to the other members of the governing body.
