### What is Go 4 Schools?


Go 4 schools (Go4) is an online school data system which gives you access to:

- Real-time assessment information
- Your child's timetable
- Your child's attendance
- Progress reports

### How to access Go4

In order to log in to Go 4 schools you will need to visit [www.go4schools.com](http://www.go4schools.com) and click on the parents icon at the top right hand side.

Click on the **First time user?** section and enter your email address. This must be the same address that we have on file for you, otherwise it will not work. If you need to change your email address please contact [danswinney@allertongrange.com](mailto:danswinney@allertongrange.com).

This shows you all the assessments carried out by the teachers. If you click on individual areas in the marksheet summary you will see a breakdown of where the marks come from.

You will also be able to see their timetable and their attendance.

## How can I help my child?

If your child is in years 7, 8 or 9 they will have Attitude to Learning (AtL) grades for each subject. They may also have knowledge tests, summative tests or other assessments.

Attitude to Learning:

AtL Grade	Meaning
A	Outstanding effort in all areas. The student goes above and beyond
B	Good effort for the majority of the time
C	Attitude is no concern but more effort could be made
D	Some concern with effort. Student needs to address this.

E	There are serious concerns with effort.
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(A T denotes a teacher absence and a U means the teacher is unable to comment on effort)

Assessments:

Developing	A basic knowledge of the subject being studied
Secure	A strong knowledge of the subject being studied
Complex	A detailed and thorough knowledge of the subject being studied

We recommend that you look through the assessments with your child. If they have weaker assessments in some areas, help the to use their knowledge organisers to review the work that has been covered.

If your child is in years 10, 11, 12 or 13 they will also have AtL grades. However, their assessments may be linked to either GCSE grades 9-1, vocational grades or A Level grades A – E. For more information about what these grades are see the document “External Qualifications” on the school website. Again, it is recommended that you look through the assessments with your child on a regular basis to determine their strengths and areas for development so that their studies can be focussed on weaker areas.
